


Corner Joining Plates are range of L shaped brackets used with 90 degree mitre cut corner windows and doors. They are used to fix the heads and sills together and to make sure the join is lined as up squarely as possible. They sit inside the head and sill; below the exposed face, and are fixed with counter sunk screws through the face.

The Corner Joining Plates come in 3 sizes:




Depending on which window or door you are using, you will require different plates. Refer to the Size and Position guide at the end of this document to determine type(s) and quantities required.

#### Corner Joining Plates - Instructions




Step 1: Mitre cut head and sill as per production documents.



#### Step 2: Drill pilot holes.

Where possible, position corner joining plate on top of head/sill and drill through both. If not, measure and mark head/sill and screw pilot holes separately.







Where possible, position corner joining plates on top face and drill pilot holes through both plate and head/sill, being careful not to drill through sump.

#### Corner Joining Plates - Instructions







Step 3: Fix corner joining plates to one side of head/sill. Clamp corner joining plates in position and fix through pilot holes.



Step 4: Join head/sill to create corner, fix remaining side of corner joining plates. Caulk the internal section of the join, and apply seam sealer to the joining faces to ensure correct drainage and a neat joining seam, and avoid water leakage.











Use the following guide to determine which corner joint plates to use and where to position them. Different frames may use different plates.


